1) Playground	The playground group received £200 from the SSS to purchase loose parts. Pictures should be sent to Katie Wight to agree any new additions. The gardening group with C1 will plant new plants in large planters, and turn pallets into vertical planters and a musical wall. Donations accepted to the gardening group, with a focus on edible gardening. Willow is being sought to create a large willow structure. 8 Children from C2 to C6 are regularly involved in gardening work, creating bird feeders and other small projects. A funding application has been submitted to RHS for £500 to create herb planters. A playground treasure hunt will take place to fundraise, and a working day is hoped for in the spring when the weather improves. The council is in the process of recruiting a playground developer, so there is an ongoing delay.

4) Acoustics	Aviva have awarded £500 towards improvements, meaning a total of £936 being held towards acoustic panels. 2 further fundraising applications are in at present, and updates will follow. The council are addressing sgoil-àraich and the talla bidh, with the PC able to prioritise other halls.		

5) GIG	The February meeting on the GLP has resulted in a desire for greater clarity on the implementation and delivery of the GLP vision. Next GIG meeting to be held on 27/3/18.	
Update on actions as a response to CEC engagement events	As part of the informal consultation process there have been 2 engagement events with TNP and one with Drummond. The Council has confirmed that Drummond will not be a standalone GME school. They have committed to issuing a long-term Gaelic plan within six months. A written guarantee has been requested that the current C5 and C6 will progress to JGHS as expected. Re linkage with Glasgow, the CEC need more officials and to learn from GCC. A visit is being tabled. There are other issues for TNP to address such as the intake and sgoil araich. A proactive approach to staffing is needed, and job adverts have been issued. Co-production meeting not attended as draft plan showed no progress. There was an aspiration for a central location for secondary. A positive approach with CEC is needed, as PC and CnamP need to continue to work with CEC. Please see the CNP blog and regular parentmail updates for agreed actions.	

	Notes from the engagement events are pending agreement by the Council and will be circulated next week, council permitting (w/c 19/3/18).		
Treasurer's report	£6440 account balance, including nearly £1000 for acoustics, and £2000 for the 2017 SSS. Funding for the bike racks has not been requested. The Spring round of SSS will open on 23/4/18, and close on 11/5/18, with the decision announced 1/6/18. Volunteers are required for the assessment panel. A change of criteria for the SSS is being implemented - changing wording to either benefitting the largest number of children possible, or benefitting a smaller number of children where the impact on these children is substantial in line with the aim and functions of the PC, as set out in the PC constitution. The Dyslexia awareness work is a perfect example of the smaller groups benefiting. Those whose applications are denied can re-apply, but should think about why they were denied. AGM survey	In 2016, 20% of parents surveyed rated their knowledge of the PC as 5/5. By 2017 that figure has climbed to 47%. 97% are happy with Parentmail as the primary form of communication, followed by meetings then facebook. Road Safety	The crossing is to be installed on Stanwell St during the Easter break. Cllr Booth is chasing this. Katie McWilliam Soane is working on a school travel plan. When actions are identified, CEC have 6 months to action them. Data collected 3 years ago can be used. Newbattle College have issued positive feedback after working with TnP.

Staff are undergoing nurture training, child protection training, personal learning, and sharing classroom practice.

Literacy and Immersion Policy change - in line with the government policy for GME, English Phonics teaching will begin in C4 rather than the end of C3. This will give learners a little longer to embed Gaelic phonics securely. This change will apply to this year's C3.

SNSA - English standardised assessment this session, Gaelic next session. The SNSA website is available in Gaelic. These tests are not about league tables, and are used in C4 and C7.

6.6 new teachers are required next session. Query over the location of P1s next session, potentially requiring the larger rooms to be split and the ICT suite removed.
