1. Playground	Natasha read out a report from Lizzy. Developing the planting area is complete. Agreed it looks wonderful. Compost area is being developed There is a new Health and Safety body who is reviewing standards. Inspection report has been received. No significant issues. It is being reviewed internally initially.

Edinburgh Marathon Festival - Many families and several staff will be taking part in events the EMF next Saturday and we wish them all the best. In 2020 we're aiming to get a team together to raise funds for the school. This has been a very successful type of fundraising for other local schools e.g. Broughton Primary has raised thousands of pounds in recent years whilst building school community spirit and promoting a healthy active lifestyle through training events and the EMF itself. May 2020 is a long way off but entries will open soon and the junior events always sell out. The Small Sums Scheme has kindly agreed to provide funding to purchase a number of places in the junior events which will be prioritised for pupils who may not otherwise be able to enter due to cost. To be discussed with the school how this will operate but please invite people to get in touch if interested in being part of organising team.

School branded tote bags and travel mugs - Agreed that Gaelic phrases on bags would be better than school branded ones. This would be used to support funds. Branded mugs, keep mugs and water bottles were also suggested.

5. GIG Group	Brian Thunder - Next meeting on 12th June which will focus on education. Comann nam Pàrant have come up with a system to encourage more involvement with 4 working groups who will produce a report to be shown at the AGM on 22nd May. This will give updates on Early Years, Primary and Secondary. Comms group will give a report to show how the work they are doing will make it easier for people to access information and communicate ideas. Need a complete understanding of what people want and agreement on the strategy that they are working towards. Request for people to come to the AGM which will be in James Gillespies, contribute to a working group. They will also be looking for a new convener, treasurer and secretary. The new working groups now make it an easier job for the convenor.		
Treasurer's report	At the end of April we had just under £8000 in the bank, £3184 belongs to the Acoustic Fund. I have been providing funds for the Small Sums Scheme projects that were successful. There are still some outstanding from the Spring 2018 and Winter 2018 rounds - Mosaic funding, T-shirts for run club, EMF (2020), Science Fun Day and Waterproof jackets. Lost Property Review	A new policy is to be implemented to try to deal with the sheer number of items and cut down on parents having to go through the office to look for items. PSA's will take responsibility for lost property. They will return all labelled items to the child. Anything not labelled will be placed in a lost property box. It will be reviewed when parents could get access to this box, potentially on a friday afternoon. Anything not collected will be sent to charity at the end of a term. Mobile phones and handheld devices at school	Question was asked by a parent. How do parents feel about them being in school? Mentioned that it is hard when older kids use them on the buses and in the playground before and after school. It was suggested that phones are not always shut off during school. The management team said that the school policy was that phones should not be used in the classroom or playground. Difficult to enforce phones being shut off. Question whether there was a council policy about this? There seems to be a variety of approaches in different schools. Headteacher update	Eco and Environment - poster campaign for school gates, car parking map. Crisp pack recycling has started - bin in the dining hall. Discussion on how to cut down on milk carton waste. Abbeyhill school swapped ordering milk cartons for a milk jug and cups. Some parents are not ordering milk for school to avoid using plastic.		

ASN support & Dekko comics

Dekko comics was developed by someone who had difficulty learning in school. Some text books have been created and he is interested in seeing if some Gaelic versions could be created. He has been in touch with Storlann. The management team will take this forward.

Mental health and well being

lona Brown gave a presentation on the Mental Health Foundation. They recommend what should be used in a school setting. Some examples we use are; soft start in school, greeting every child with a handshake in the morning, circle time, assemblies, nurture classes, social skills groups are run, mind maps, forest school, buddy system, bake sales, Pupil voice.

It was agreed that the handshake between teacher and child at the beginning of the day is really great!
